

LAPTOP USERS NEED LONG BATTERY LIFE



29% of Laptop Users Spend More than 10 Hours a Day Unplugged

The most important feature for a laptop is its portability. Nearly all laptop users say the ability to be “on the go” and work untethered from desks or outlets is important. This is only possible with a laptop that has great battery life.

Hybrid work requires thin and light laptops with reliable all-day battery life. Nearly two-thirds of workers spend at least some time away from their typical workspace.

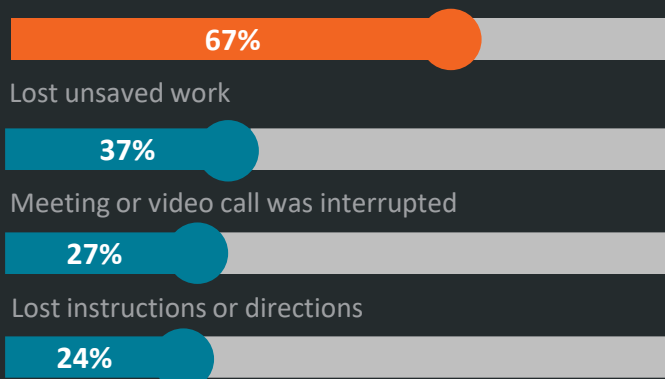
Laptop users are increasingly on the go and don’t always have time to charge their laptops. The average user spends more than three hours a day on battery power.

Suffered any consequence from dead battery



With increased mobility comes increased risk that laptop users will run out of battery while on the go. More than a third (37%) say they have lost unsaved work, more than a quarter (27%) have had a meeting or video call interrupted by a dying battery, and 24% have lost instructions or directions they needed when a battery died on them.
